Themes

- To protect freedom and security of Europe and its citizens
- To gather together different kinds of rescue drills from EU cross-border regions in order to develop a stronger European dimension to security end-users in the EU
- To learn from lessons developed in existing drills, as well as framework programme 7 projects that have been implemented
- To develop new and promising solutions for European situational awareness in rescue services, to develop and agree on the core set of specifications of the specific European system and put together a roadmap for research still needed for its development
- To enhance EU Civil protection mechanisms as well as safety and security of citizens

Potential project activities we can implement

Stage 0: Gathering security actors together and briefing about the background of existing drills

Stage 1: Describing the inter/national drills and gathering their findings

Stage 2: Negotiations among key actors

Stage 3: Cross-Sectoral participation in drills in each partner region

Stage 4: Developing a Guidebook to European networks to tackle major crisis events in the Arctic and other European sparsely populated areas
